

A Running Start

AMONG THE MORE THAN 38,000 starters at the 2006 New York City Marathon in November were 358 Achilles athletes with disabilities from around the world. They represented the Achilles Track Club, whose mission is to enable people with all types of disabilities to participate in mainstream athletics.

Achilles honored AIG President and CEO Martin Sullivan at its 16th annual tribute dinner in November 2006 with its Albert H. Gordon Award. The award is named after a Wall Street icon, philanthropist and one of the club's original board members—still a board member almost 25 years later at 105 years old.
